**Templar Knights in history:** Payen de Montdidier was related to the Counts of Flanders and is a founding knight of the Knights Templar. He established a Preceptory at Oxford, England because of strong support from Queen Matilda. The Queen, wife of Stephen I, King of England (1135 - 1154) and a niece of Baldwin I of Jerusalem and Godfrey of Bouillon made Oxford one of the richest and most important centers of Templar's in England. Payen de Montdidier established a Preceptory at Temple Guiting near Cheltenham.
